Entrance Antiphon

Acts 1:11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

1st Reading

Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Important Notice

We are pleased to advise that from Tuesday 19th May 2020, the church will be opened Tuesday to Sunday for a maximum of 10 worshippers at the times specified in the Temporary Schedule. Visit time should be limited so other parishioners also have a chance to pray.

Please note: all entering the Church must leave their name and contact details for COVID-safe purposes and social distancing and hygiene measures must be observed at all times.

Mass

A maximum of ten people only are permitted in the congregation at each mass.

All places for each Mass must be pre-booked. Booking can be requested no more than 7 days in Advance by contacting the parish office on **029774-3662** between **9.00am & 3.30pm (Tuesday** to Friday only). Available places are allocated in the order requests are received. Only one reservation at a time will be accepted to give more people a chance to attend Mass.

Names and contact details for each person must be given. Names will be checked off on arrival before the mass.

Although public Mass is now available, the small number permitted in the congregation means most parishioners still will be unable to attend Mass therefore the archbishop's dispensation from the usual obligation to attend Sunday Mass still applies.

Confessions/Private Prayer

Confessions will be heard in the Church at the times given in the temporary Schedule. Bookings are not required for these confessions or to visit for private prayer. However, all entering the church must leave their names and contact details for Covid- Safe purposes, only ten people are permitted inside the church, and social distancing and hygiene measures must be observed at all times.

Directives for Churches and Liturgies under Step One of the relaxation of restrictions during the COVID-19 pandemic, 13 May 2020

From this Friday, 15 May 2020, in New South Wales:

- churches may reopen for private prayer and Confessions, as long as no more than 10 people are in the church at once (this must be supervised by the parish priest or delegate)
- religious gatherings are permitted with congregations of up to 10 for Masses, Weddings, Baptisms, Eucharistic adoration, the Divine Office, Rosary in common, Bible study etc.
- up to 20 mourners indoors or 30 mourners outdoors are permitted for Funerals
- · contact details of all those entering the church (name, phone number, email address) must be recorded
- spatial distancing (at least 1½m from each other) and hygiene directions (including regularly disinfecting the church) must be observed; attendees are exhorted to take care when coughing or sneezing and to avail themselves of hand sanitizer provided
- the very elderly, those with symptoms, those with a compromised immune or respiratory system are asked to stay at home

Future relaxations of the CovidSafe provisions are expected over coming months, in at least two more stages, but this will depend upon infection rates not spiking and churches being able to demonstrate responsible behaviour.

Further special directives have been issued for the celebration of Baptisms, Confessions, Masses, Worship and Reception of the Eucharist outside of Mass, Weddings, Care of the Sick, and Funerals.

Priests must exercise judgment in deciding whether it is yet practicable to conduct public Masses. Even were Sunday Masses multiplied, the majority of the faithful will be unable to attend and so are dispensed from attending Sunday Mass. The faithful can keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day, watching Mass on television or online, and asking God for the graces they would normally receive in Holy Communion ('spiritual communion').
