Gospel Reflection

Where does God really dwell?


The Ten Commandments are badly named. Rather, they are the Ten Responses which should characterise a liberated people, freed from slavery by 'the Lord, your God'.

By the time Jesus came on the scene, the Temple in Jerusalem was no longer a fit dwelling place for a God who desires to free people from oppression and exploitation. To the contrary, Jesus saw the Temple ideology as placing undue burdens and shackles on people. His anger at this erupted in dramatic street theatre. His overturning of the tables of the money-changers signalled the overturning of the

What Our Lord revealed to uncomprehending authorities was that His body was the true sanctuary. The body of Jesus of Nazareth is the dwelling place of God, the habitation of the Lord God who liberates people. In short, God's sanctuary is not a place, but a person.

We could take a moment to pray, using the Ten Responses to review and guide our reflection and practice as we move towards Easter. This will help us to celebrate the enigmatic saying: 'Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it again.'

Gospel

Jn 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

Safeguarding Children and Volunteers in St Christopher's Parish:

In response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, the Catholic Achdiocese of Sydney established The Safeguarding and Ministerial Integrity Office in 2015. One of the roles of the Safeguarding Office is to raise awareness regarding our collective responsibility to protect the safety, well-being and dignity of children and young people.

While we all, as a Parish, need to be aware of our role in protecting children and becoming familiar with the cultural change within the Church, we need to ensure that all volunteers in roles of trust and responsibility fulfil the necessary requirements mandated by the Archdiocese.

All Volunteers in our Parish will need to ensure that they have:

- 1. A current Working With Children Check (WWCC). This is easy to obtain and is free. To obtain or renew your WWCC go to the website: https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children- check
- 2. Complete a Volunteer Registration Acceptance Form (available in the church foyer or from the Parish Office)
- 3. Read and Sign the Code of Conduct for Working With Children (available in the church foyer or from the Parish Office)

The list of Volunteer positions requiring the above documentation is quite extensive and has recently been extended. The list includes Parish Priests, Assistant Priests; Parish Secretaries; Youth Ministers, Workers or Leaders; Sacramental Coordinators and Group Leaders; Catechists; Children's Liturgy Coordinators and Leaders; Acolytes and Senior Altar Servers; Ministers of the Altar; Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion; Ministers of the Word (Readers); Parish Counters/Collectors/Wardens; Pious Goods Stall assistants; Parish Pastoral Council members; Ministers to the Housebound and Choir members.

Many of you may wonder why this is necessary when you seemingly don't come into direct contact with children. The reality is that you, by engaging in that Ministry, are in a position of TRUST. Children see you as someone who is in a significant role in the Parish and thus someone they can trust. While we may never have had an issue here at St Christophers, unfortunately, the historic evidence shows us that people in these positions have, at times, abused that position of trust. That is why the Archdiocese is being proactive and responding to the evidence they have been presented with. It is up to us to help so that all processes can be seen to be transparent.

There is also a legal requirement that all volunteers comply with the request. Failure to complete a WWCC attracts a hefty fine (\$11,000) per person and for the Parish. Father Salas is responsible for ensuring that all requirements are met.


