

"They saw the empty tomb and believed"

Today, we celebrate Easter, the feast of all feasts, the feast of faith and hope. As St Paul Says "If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is empty and your faith comes to nothing" (1Cor 15: 14). Yes, the resurrection of Jesus is the crowning point of the history of our salvation and foundation of our Christian faith. For this reason, the Easter acclamation "Alleluia" becomes our song of joy to praise and thank the Lord for the wonders that our Lord has worked for us.

Mary of Magdala loved Jesus beyond words, and that was what led her to the tomb the next day morning looking for him. But to her surprise, she could see only the empty tomb. This was the same experience that the disciples had when they went to look for him. But, the love that they had for Jesus removed all their fears and doubts, and they began to believe in the mystery of the risen lord. Therefore, to understand the mystery of the risen lord we need love him in the first place, because, the more we love him the more he will reveal his mystery to us. And to experience him, we need to gather in his name and listen to his words, and partake in the divine fellowship, the Eucharist.

The feast of Easter invites us to be the messengers of the resurrection and to witness the risen Lord. We need to proclaim Jesus who is the source and foundation of hope, love and joy. We all need to die with him and die to self to rise with him to new life. Let's try to understand this deeper significance of Easter and wish one another on this occasion of celebrating the joy of the Risen Lord.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
