Gospel Reflection

Guts in a Knot

When Jesus saw the crowds 'he felt sorry for them'. The Greek original actually says 'his guts were in a knot'. When Jesus saw a desperate need he found it stomach-churning stuff.

Our bodies often tell us what we should pray for. Another good signal is tears, not only of sadness but also of joy.

Body-felt impulse and prayer go together, whether celebrating good things or confronting bad things. This is what our Lord wants and, where possible, leading to effective action... labourers in the harvest.

So, when our body gives us the signal – stomach in a knot, or tremendous joy flooding into our lives – follow the body's signals. Pray for the person or the situation concerned. You can be sure that your prayer will be authentic.

Mt 9:36-10:8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows:

'Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.'

Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: A Spiritual Journey

The pilgrims from our parishes and from around Sydney left for the long-awaited pilgrimage to the Holy Land in the evening on 21 may 2023.

This sacred journey was filled with awe-inspiring visits to numerous holy places including Dead Sea, Mount Nebo, River Jordan, Cana, Sea of Galilee, Nazareth, Mount Tabor, Mount of Olives, Mount of Temptations, Gethsemane Garden, Holy Sepulchre, Mount Zion, The Upper Room, Bethany etc. The pilgrimage was a great opportunity for us pilgrims to deepen our spiritual connection and understanding of the historical and religious significance of these revered sites.

We began our visits with the Dead Sea, the Earth's lowest point and one of the world's saltiest bodies of water. The journey to Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, one of the Seven Wonders of the World was a time to enjoy the amazing history unfolding before us. Renewal of the Marriage vows at Cana was a memorable event for the seven married couples in the group who made use of the opportunity to strengthen their bond of marriage.

Though the weather was so hot, we all renewed the baptismal Promises by standing by the River Jordan where Jesus received baptism from John the Baptist.

The journey from Bethlehem to Mount olives, which included various places of importance in the life of Jesus and in salvation - history was a time of profound spiritual experience.

The visits to Masada and the Western Wall Tunnel Walk were an enriching experience that allowed us to immerse ourselves in Jewish history, culture, and spirituality. These sacred sites also reminded us of the strength and endurance of the Jewish people throughout history.

We were fortunate to have mass and morning prayer every day, and other devotions whenever we could. We made it a point that we prayed for all our families and parishioners every day without fail. The good Lord guarded us and brought us back safe and sound on the 3rd of June, while some of us extended our trips to Egypt or to Europe. In short, the pilgrimage to the Holy Land was a transformative and spiritually enriching experience. I wish to thank all of you for your prayers and support for the pilgrimage.


