Feast of St Francis De Sales - 24th January

St Francis de Sales: The Gentleman Doctor for the Everyday



St. Francis, who is well known as "the Gentleman Saint" because of his patience and gentleness, was born on 21 August 1567 in France. St. Francis was one of the greatest evangelists and the most powerful confessors during the Counter-Reformation. His writings on Catholic spirituality still inspire the faithful today and his words still resonate across the centuries.

At his weekly general audience at the Vatican, Pope Benedict XVI said that St. Francis de Sales believed and wrote that "divine love is the reason for all things" and that his views, which were influential during his lifetime between the 16th and 17th centuries, are still relevant today.

Pope Francis' letter was titled "Totum Amoris Est" ("Everything Pertains to Love") and was released by the Vatican Dec. 28, 2022, on the occasion of the 400th anniversary of the death of St. Francis de Sales. The saintly bishop developed a new approach to spiritual direction, the pope said. "It was a method that renounced all harshness and respected completely the dignity and gifts of a devout soul, whatever its frailties." Even before the Second Vatican Council would teach 350 years later, the pope wrote, St. Francis de Sales knew and wrote that every person was called to holiness and that the call was specific to each person and his or her talents, shortcomings and state in life.

St. Francis taught how to live in the world and to appreciate it, but also to maintain a proper detachment from it and it remains a valuable lesson for men and women in our own time. Today his spirituality is widespread because his guidance is easy and practical.

He died on 28 December 1622 and was buried on 24 January 1623. He was beatified in 1661 by Pope Alexander VII, who then canonized him four years later. He was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1877. In 1923, Pope Pius XI proclaimed him a patron of writers and journalists, because he made extensive use of broadsheets and books both in spiritual direction and in his efforts to convert the Calvinists of the region.

And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had

threatened.
